Who We Are and What We Do

The BC Primary Health Care Research Network (BC-PHCRN) is one of 11 networks across Canada that are part of the pan-Canadian Primary and Integrated Health Care Innovations Network (PIHCIN), launched by the Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR) Strategy for Patient Oriented Research (SPOR) program to support evidence-informed transformation of the delivery of primary and integrated health care.

BC-PHCRN's purpose is to encourage, facilitate, and support collaborations between government, health authorities, health professionals, patients and researchers.

Objectives and priorities

- Development of health care outcomes measurement and primary care system and integrated care performance monitoring;
- Generation of knowledge through collaborative research;
- Knowledge translation and exchange across the network, BC, and Canada with patient-partners/ families, communities, researchers, clinicians, and policymakers; and
- Development and implementation of processes to spread evidence-informed integrated health innovations.

Network governance

- **Tripartite Leadership:** Research, clinical, and policy leads.
- Advisory Committee: Representatives from key partner organizations and stakeholder groups with the capacity to provide advice, skills, and resources key to the success of the network.
- Patient Advisory: 10 patient-partners guide our patient engagement work, participate as investigators in research projects, and act as a resource for knowledge translation and exchange.
